

HEALTH & SAFETY TRAINING REQUIREMENTS



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Each chapter must complete training on H&S annually. At a minimum, each chapter must participate in training on the fraternity's Health and Safety policy that is provided by the District Counselor, the Supreme Council, or other approved party.

For all training events, the chapter's Master Alchemist, Vice Master Alchemist, Reporter, Recorder, Treasurer, Master of Ceremonies, Alumni Secretary, Health & Safety Officer, any social chairs (as applicable), and 50% of pledges and active brothers must attend the training. Should insufficient people attend the presentation, additional members may attend another training session offered by the organization.

To earn credit toward eligibility for the two-star or three-star chapter awards, the chapter can complete additional training related to health and safety. These training courses can be presented by the Supreme Council, the local institution, or a local health advocacy group approved by the DC.

Requirements for additional courses include:

- Scheduled for no less than 60 minutes.
- Related to the following topics (or approved in advance by the GHSO): Alcohol/Drug Awareness & Safety, Bystander Intervention, Hazing Prevention, Personal/Relationship Violence Safety, Sexual Health
