# From the Grand Collegiate Alchemist

November is an exciting time in the fraternity as the new member education process is in full swing and most chapters are drawing very close to initiation. It is essential that all brothers - officers or not - remember the purpose of new member education and of our rituals. New member activities are intended to show potential new members who we are, what our organization has to offer, what is expected of our brothers, and how our organization functions (both locally and nationally). As you prepare your pledges, make sure you're teaching them correct, up-to-date information by referring to the Fraternity Canon and the current Fraternity Sourcebook throughout the process. The document is updated every summer to ensure that all of the correct people are identified and all of the information is still correct. Our rituals are designed to bind us together in brotherhood - every brother dating back to the beginning of our order has gone through a form of this ritual. It is required for chapters to perform the full ritual exactly as written. While some parts of the instructions identify places where chapters can use their artistic expression and local character to contribute to the experience, the majority of the process is explicitly prescribed. Remember that fidelity to the ritual as written and to the experience of the initiate outweigh any "chapter traditions" or the experiences of the brothers performing it. While we've made recent tweaks to ensure proper attention to changes in safety rules, the chapter is responsible for knowing if local laws and school policies exist that are stricter than our rules. If you're ever unsure how to make your initiation the best it could be, your DC, the GMC, or I would be happy to chat and help you problem solve.

## Back to Basics: Order of Altotus

The Order of Altotus (OA) was created in 1932 and its membership is composed of past Grand Master Alchemists. They are not voting members of the Grand Chapter, but they serve as an advisory board to the Supreme Council. There are currently eighteen living members of the Order of Altotus, ranging from Lynn Swanson (Beta, 1963) who served as GMA from 1984-1986 to the most recent inductee into the order, Sean Pawlowski (Gamma Upsilon, 2006) who just finished his term as GMA. As the immediate past Grand Master Alchemist, Sean holds the title of Grand Vizier.

The Grand Vizier holds special responsibilities, including acting as an advisor to the Grand Master Alchemist and the Supreme Council and serving as the chair of the General Advisory Committee. The Grand Vizier is also an ex-officio, non-voting member of the Nominating Committee (this committee solicits nominees for the elections for Professional Representatives and the Supreme Council). Additionally, In the event that all members of the Supreme Council become unable to serve, the Grand Vizier shall fill the office of Grand Master Alchemist until an election and installation can be held. This happened for the first time at the end of the 57th Biennial Conclave in 2022 thanks to an outbreak of COVID-19. Then-GV Helen Webster (Alpha Rho, 1994) presided over the closing awards ceremony because all of the members of the outgoing Supreme Council were unable to do so and the new Council had yet to be sworn in.

Honorary membership in the Order of Altotus has been given to 2 different individuals. The first honorary member was John R. Kuebler (Epsilon, 1910) who served as the Grand Recorder for 33 years, Grand Editor for 37 years, and Grand Historian for 10 years. The second honorary member was W. Mack Barlow (Kappa, 1936) who served as Grand Master of Ceremonies for 8 years and as a District Counselor for 13 years.
