

Fraternal Memories from Mitch Levings, GH

On August 29, 2005 Hurricane Katrina slammed into the upper Gulf Coast, causing significant destruction to the entire region. The devastation in the New

Orleans area caused an extended closure of many area businesses including the universities. The Brothers of Loyola's Gamma Rho Chapter came through the category 3 storm unharmed, but many had to relocate to other universities for the semester. Brothers from around the country posted on the fraternity's website their universities' policies on taking in displaced students along with offers to help find housing and other assistance. A scheduled October installation ceremony for Gamma Rho Chapter had to be postponed until the university returned to a normal schedule. Before the hurricane hit, the Supreme Council had given Gamma Rho authorization to pledge and initiate qualified candidates from nearby Xavier University, Dillard University and Tulane University, but with all the area universities closed, Gamma Rho wouldn't be exercising their authority.

Professional Brother Spotlight

Brother Sera graduated from UC Berkeley where she was initiated into the Sigma Chapter of Alpha Chi Sigma in 1994. She currently has two master's degrees from the University of Bordeaux: one in viticulture and oenology and the second is in chemical analysis with a focus on the oenological process. She has had a successful career in oenology in California, Japan, and France.

Earlier this year, she had defended her doctoral thesis in oenology at the University of Bordeaux. In her project, she applied many analytical methods but in particular HPLC-FLD and GC-tandem MS/MS to study compound release over time by Champagne reserve wine lees, the sediment that settles to the bottom of tanks and barrels, and how they contribute to the quality of aging. Despite (or perhaps due to) many technical problems that arose, she was able to make it one of the most memorable presentations for her department! After all was said and done, there was no more fitting of a celebration than with the very subject of her thesis – champagne!

Chocolate Pecan Pie by PR Mic Le

There's a day for everything and August 20th happens to be Chocolate Pecan Pie Day! Folks love pecan pie and this twist with chocolate chips adds a nice new layer to a classic dessert. This one comes from my own book of personal recipes which I don't normally share with anyone!

You can easily make the pie crust at home especially if you have a food processor but in the wise words of Ina Garten, store bought is fine.

Pie Crust – Prep time: 10 minutes (plus 1-2 hours refrigeration)

- 1½ c flour
- ½ tbls white sugar
- ½ tsp salt
- ½ stick butter, unsalted, cubed and chilled
- ½ c shortening, chilled
- ~4 tbls ice water
- 1. In a bowl, mix together the flour, sugar and salt
- 2. Cut in the chilled butter and shortening using a fork until crumbly
- -- If using a food processor, just throw it all in and pulse --
- 3. Gradually add 1 tbls of ice water at a time continue to mix until combined
- 4. Cover in wrap and refrigerate for 1-2 hours

Filling – Prep time: 15 minutes; bake time: ~ 60 minutes

½ stick butter, unsalted

½ to 1 c chocolate chips, semisweet

3 eggs, lightly whisked

2/3 c corn syrup, light or dark

½ c brown sugar, light

1 tbls cocoa powder, unsweetened

1 tbls vanilla extract

½ tsp salt

1½ c pecans, rough chopped

- 1. Preheat oven to 350o F
- 2. Roll out pie crust for a 9-inch baking dish
- 3. In a small pan, melt butter and half of the chocolate chips and set aside to cool slightly
- 4. In a bowl, combine whisked eggs, corn syrup, sugar, cocoa, salt, vanilla extract until smooth
- 5. Stir in chopped pecans and the remaining chocolate chips
- 6. Stir in the melted chocolate/butter until combined
- 7. Pour into crust
- 8. Bake on the center rack for 60-65 minutes until set in the middle. Let cool for at least 2 hours on a wire rack before serving
